UBC Adult ID - Selection Subcommittee Terms of Reference

Preamble

The Selection Subcommittee is comprised of representatives of the UBC adult infectious diseases program and division and tasked annually with reviewing and selecting residents for the training program.

Actions of the Subcommittee

The Selection Subcommittee decides which applicants will be ranked for the PGY-4 match each year by:

- describing the program and selection criteria in a transparent way on the CaRMS website, following best practices
- reviewing each application independently based on its own merits
- conducting interviews
- assessing each candidate using a set of standardized, program-specific criteria
- ranking the candidates - a meeting is held to collectively create a ranked list
- reporting to the RPC

Applicants are assessed based on criteria including, but not restricted to:

- academic standing
- clinical training
- research and publications
- references
- goals
- interest in Adult Infectious Diseases and in UBC ID
- interpersonal skills
- leadership skills
- professionalism
- fit with the UBC Adult ID program.

Selection Subcommittee Membership

Membership on the selection subcommittee includes:

- All current adult infectious diseases faculty members of the RPC
- Adult infectious diseases faculty members at large, 3-year term
- One senior adult infectious diseases subspecialty resident, 1-year term
